Can you believe it? The Fellowship is launching upon its 24th season and making plans already for its 25th anniversary next season. It all began in 1993 when a few concerned residents of the Town of Palm Beach met in the living room of our dear departed friend, Herb

Lee, to conceive of the idea of establishing an organization aimed at addressing issues rooted in intolerance, anti-Semitism and unjust discrimination.

Herb is gone now, as are some of our other founding members, but their legacy remains with us. Fortunately they lived long enough to see their dreams begin to come alive. They began to see the Fellowship's dedication to promoting fellowship, understanding and respect among all religions and cultures take hold.

Year after year we have seen more progress. We have seen walls which have kept us apart come down and bridges which allow us to connect with one another being built. How do we know that? Because each year we see more and more people becoming more interested in the work and mission of the Fellowship. And each year we see more and more people becoming involved in our programs.

This season is no exception. Members and guests have told me they are excited about our lineup of programs, from the ever popular Fellowship Friday, to our Sunday Conversations Series, Interfaith Dialogues, our Annual Dinner, and our Arts and Essay Contest involving children from all Palm Beach County schools.

People have told me that each year our programs have improved. Several people have praised the Fellowship for this year including a Muslim, C.B. Hanif, as one of its moderators for our Interfaith Dialogues.

The Fellowship, from its very beginning, has been about inclusivity. Although founded by Christians and Jews to address a specific problem, anti-Semitism which existed at the time and which still exists (although, we believe, to a lesser extent today), the Fellowship's broader mission is and has been to address all forms of bigotry, hatred and intolerance. That is our aim and that is our goal, whatever our belief, whatever our faith, whatever our race, whatever our culture, that we all learn to understand and respect one another. Isn't that what ultimately will make this world a better place in which to live?

It is indeed important that each of us have convictions in our own belief system, in our own faith, if you will. But, is it important that all others believe as we do? Wouldn't that make for a rather boring world? Others must be respected for their differences. Exhibiting a lack of respect and insisting that others join us in our belief system only leads to the consequences we often see in our world today, more hatred, more intolerance, more suffering and more fighting. It is a goal of the Fellowship to put an end to such consequences.

We know that goal will never be entirely achieved but we will not be discouraged from continuing to try. So, join us. We welcome your involvement. We welcome your thoughts and ideas. We welcome your support. Let us work together toward the formation of a better understanding and a common respect for our fellow human kind. Let us work together toward a more perfect union.
