Chairman's Message

for 25 years

Welcome back, friends, to another year of Fellowship. This year will prove to be an exciting and noteworthy year in the life of the Fellowship as we celebrate our 25th anniversary. It is hard to believe that this much time has gone by since the Fellowship was founded in 1993 as a result of the concerns of a handful of people who sought to deal with the intolerance, disrespect, and anti-Semitism which existed

in the Town at the time. Our theme this year is, aptly, Seeking Common Ground.

We have a great lineup of programs for you this season, from our ever-popular Fellowship Friday, which occurs the day after Thanksgiving, our Sunday Series, our Annual Dinner, our Essay & Creative Arts Competition, and the Interfaith Dialogues, revamped and renamed as Pizza & Pathways this season.

We are very excited about the speaker we have scheduled for this year's Annual Dinner. Rabbi Lord Jonathan Sacks is an internationally renowned theologian and author whose work is admired by Christians and Jews alike, and indeed by people of all faiths. Rabbi Sacks wrote a book called **Not in God's Name**, which is a book about confronting religious violence. It is a book which is so apropos to what is happening in the world today. I would like to quote a short paragraph from Rabbi Sacks' book.

Too often in the history of religion, people have killed in the name of the God of Life, waged war in the name of the God of Peace, hated in the name of the God of Love, and practiced cruelty in the name of the God of Compassion. When this happens, God speaks, sometimes in a still, small voice, almost inaudible beneath the clamor of those claiming to speak on his behalf. What he says at such times is: "Not in my name."

To me these words are so relevant in today's society, so timely, and so in line with the work of the Fellowship. I do not remember, in my lifetime, a period of such turmoil based upon the attitude of fundamentalist faiths towards those who believe differently than they. Why do we insist that others believe as we do? Indeed, it is important that we remain convicted to our thoughts and beliefs in regard to faith, politics, and other issues we may hold dear, but why do we insist that others share our beliefs?

We see that it is that insistence that is creating havoc, fighting, and killing in the world today. As part of its mission, the Fellowship seeks to put an end to that. We attempt to accomplish that goal and others through education and dialogue; by sitting together at

the table to attempt to understand what makes us the same and what makes us different and to learn to appreciate those differences. We know we will never see an end to prejudice and conflict, but it is our hope that we, with your help, can make some progress toward having people better respect one another in order that we can make the world a better place in which to live.

My thanks to each and every one of you, our members and supporters, for working with us to assist in accomplishing our goals and our mission.

The week-long workshop is held at the international professional development organization's headquarters in Brookline, Massachusetts. The Fellowship sent six educators to the life-changing program in July 2017, The teachers are incorporating the lessons in their classrooms to help their students make the connection between history and moral choices in their own lives.

Their goal was to foster better understanding and respect among people of all faiths.

Guest Speaker: Rabbi Lord Jonathan Sacks

The Fellowship is delighted to welcome **Rabbi Lord Jonathan Sacks** of London as our keynote speaker at the 2018 Annual Dinner. Rabbi Sacks served as the Chief Rabbi of the United Hebrew Congregations of the Commonwealth from 1991-2013.

A frequent and sought-after contributor to radio, television, and the press, both in Britain and around the world, Rabbi Sacks is the author of more than 30 books, including the recent bestseller, *Not in God's Name: Confronting Religious Violence*.

Rabbi Sacks received the 2016 Templeton Prize in recognition of his "exceptional contributions to affirming life's spiritual dimension," and recently received the 2017 Irving Kristol Award from the American Enterprise Institute.





2018 John C. Randolph Award

The *John C. Randolph Award* was established in 2004 to honor a person or organization in the community who exemplifies the mission of the Palm Beach Fellowship of Christians & Jews. Presented annually, our highest accolade was named for our current chair, who also served in that capacity for a decade in the early days of the organization.

Our 2018 recipient, **Joyce McLendon**, was a founding member of the Fellowship and served in various leadership capacities through the years including secretary and program chair. Still an active member of the Board of Directors, she was instrumental on several committees and in activities such as Fellowship Week.

Joyce was also a founder of The Lord's Place and the Arthritis Foundation. Known for her quiet philanthropy, hands-on participation, and passion for the causes she champions, Joyce has also been involved locally with the Lighthouse for the Blind, Alzheimer's Association, John A. Marshall Foundation, and the YWCA.




